They provide midwifery care throughout the pregnancy, labour and after the birth, to low-risk women planning a home birth. The HSE has engaged the services of these midwives to provide midwifery services to expectant mothers wishing to have their babies at home. There are also 2 other experienced hospital midwives available to attend as 2nd midwives at home births.
