Basic Life Support for Health Care Professionals (Irish Heart Foundation/American Heart Association)

Aim:

The aim of the BLS Course is to teach healthcare professionals how to perform high-quality CPR individually or as part of a team. BLS skills are applicable to any healthcare setting. BLS students will learn rescue techniques for adult, children, and infants.

Content:

- Adult and paediatric CPR including two rescuer scenarios
- Use of bag valve mask (BVM) and barrier devices
- Management of foreign body airway obstruction (FBAO),
- Use of AED's.

Course participants are evaluated by skills testing and a written evaluation- Multiple choice questions (MCQ).
